Kavish is a property litigation specialist with experience of alternative dispute resolution procedures. Kavish's experience includes acting as an arbitrator in a COVID rent arrears dispute, acting for parties in mediations, writing an advice for an independent expert appointed by parties to determine a new rent, taking part in the prestigious Willem C Vis International Commercial Arbitration Moot in Vienna, acting as an arbitrator in the Budapest pre-moot, and mediating as part of a competition run by the Worshipful Company of Arbitrators.

In 2021, together with Guy Fetherstonhaugh KC, Kavish wrote in the Estates Gazette about the (then proposed) mandatory arbitration model for resolving commercial rent arrears accrued during the pandemic. In 2023, together with Edward Peters KC, Kavish wrote in the New Law Journal about compulsory arbitration in landlord and tenant disputes.
